Day 7

A tour of the sculpture garden followed by a wine tasting at one of the largest wineries in the region.



Day 4

A visit to the design gallery. A boat ride, afterwards a wine dinner in the cellar with a wine tasting of Pinotage. Accommodation in a hotel overlooking Walker Bay where you can see whales, sharks, dolphins, seals, and penguins.



Day 8

Fly back to Moscow or continue your journey with a safari or a visit to Victoria Falls.

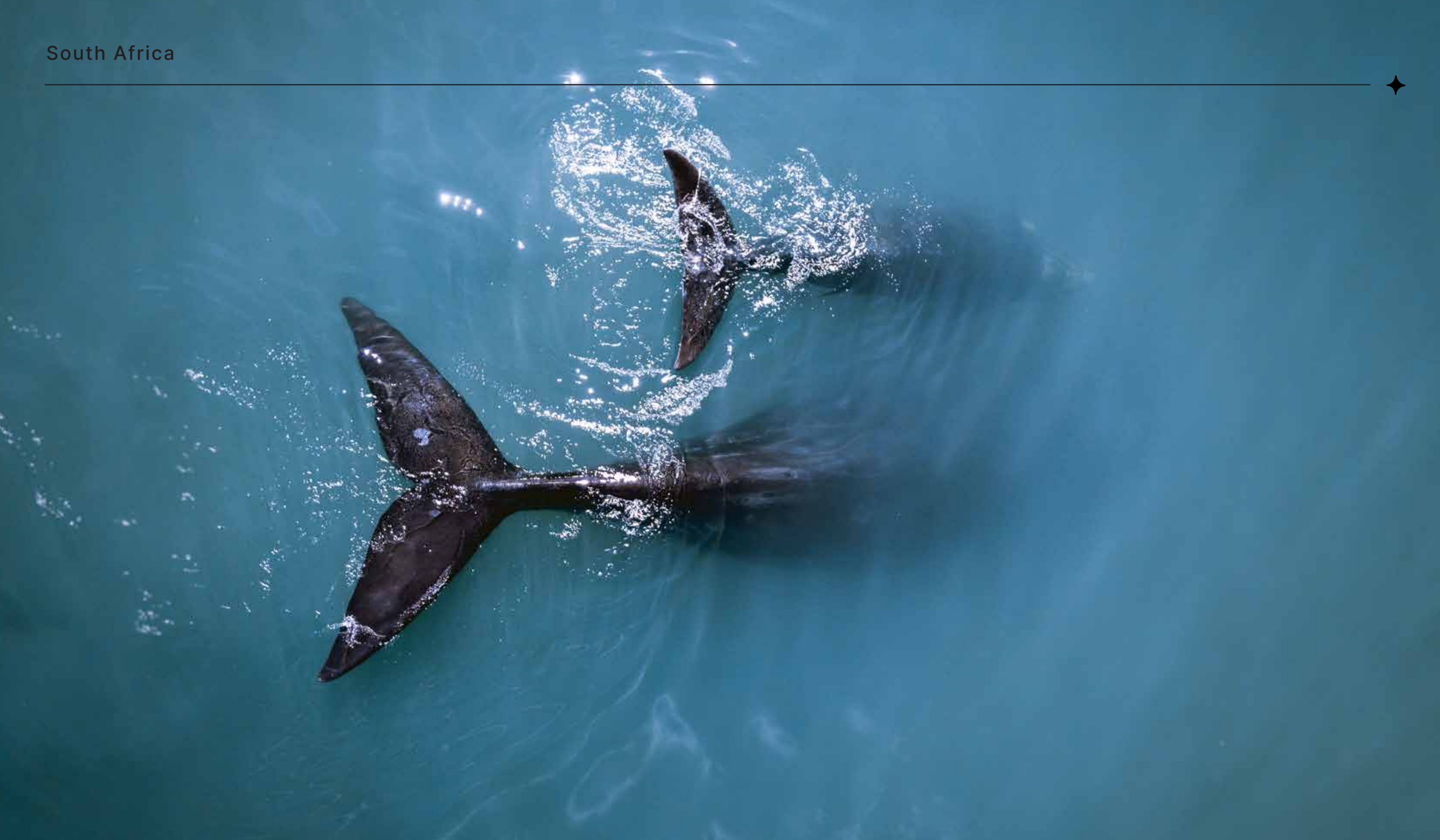

Chapman Peak in Cape Town

How was it even possible to build a road in the rocks? Local engineers managed to defeat rockfalls and stubborn cliffs with the help of modern technology. Nine kilometers of winding road connects North Hoek with the Hoot Bay area. Chapman's Peak Drive has 114 tight turns and fantastic ocean views. It's not just a road, but a real attraction that takes your breath away.

Museum of Contemporary Art in Cape Town

The Zeitz Museum has the largest collection of modern African art. It is a museum on the same scale and significance as the giants such as the Guggenheim and the Tate Modern.

The Zeitz building on the waterfront itself is already a landmark with an interesting history. It used to be a granary, recognized as a monument to industrial architecture. To create a museum, it was reconstructed. The site was reconstructed as a gigantic and fantastical, gigantic artifact that is breathtaking in its very appearance.



Arts and architecture

The city's culture was influenced by the British and the Dutch, and there is a lot of minimalist Cape architecture. 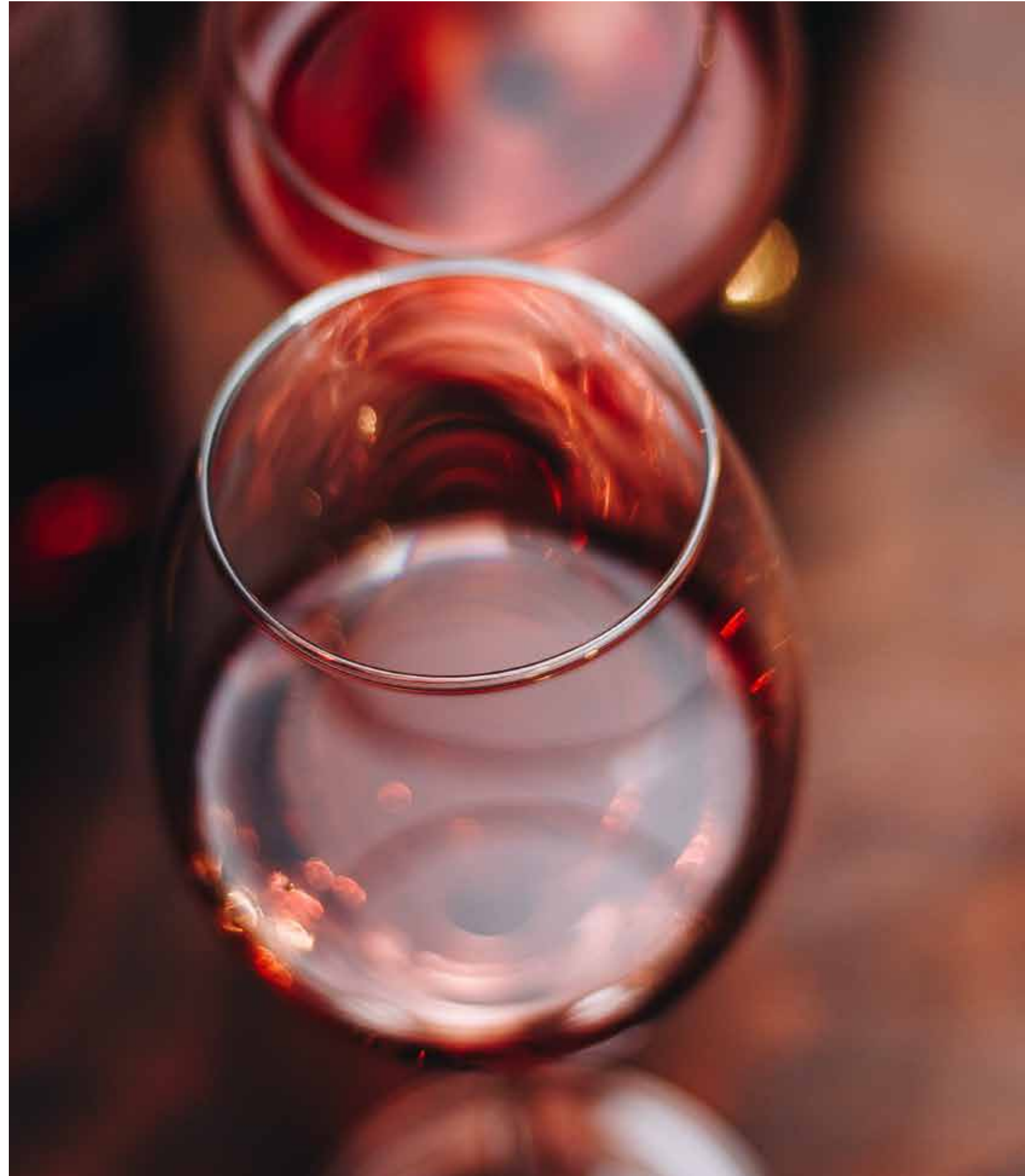

Winemaking

South Africa's winemaking regions have a climate reminiscent of the Mediterranean; it is not too hot, and the valleys are protected from strong winds. The five wine-producing zones produce wines not only for domestic consumption but also for export. Among the grape varieties that have been grown in the country for centuries are Chardonnay, Chenin blanc and Cabernet Sauvignon. Here even the well-known varieties acquire a more interesting taste: for example, experts note more tannins and new fruit tones in the same Cabernet Sauvignon. The unique South African Pinotage deserves special attention, incorporating the best qualities of Pinot Noir and Senso and surprising with its smoky and strawberry nuances.





Dylan Lewis Sculpture Garden

South African sculptor Dylan Lewis has created a unique art object in a giant garden of unique plants. More than 7 hectares, designed by renowned landscape designer Keith Kirsten. It features more than 60 bronze sculptures depicting animals and people. The garden's flora and beautiful views of Mount Stellenbosch complete the exposition, so that a unique symbiosis of culture and art a unique symbiosis of culture and art.
