

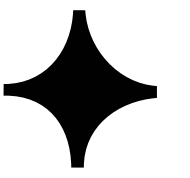

For Whom this trip?

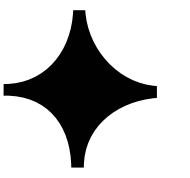
For active women who are looking for new ways to develop both their careers and themselves

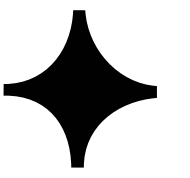

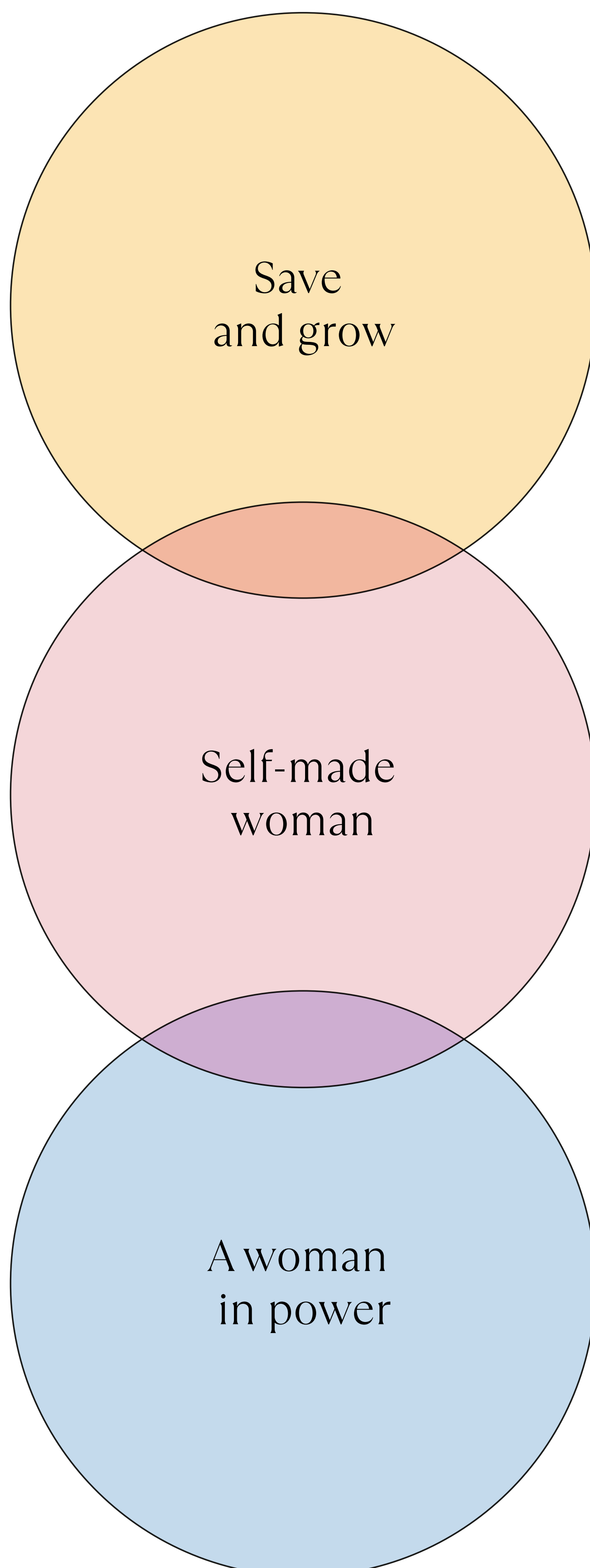

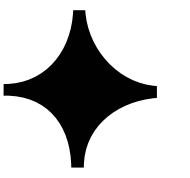

Sheri Arison

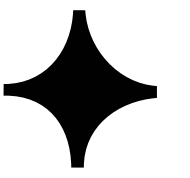

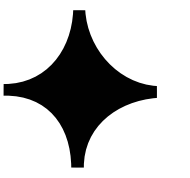
Orly Carmon

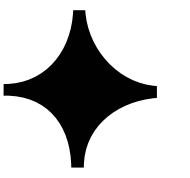

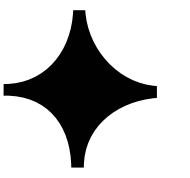

NAAMAT

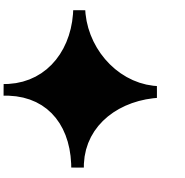
The abbreviation NAAMAT is translated from Hebrew as "Working women volunteers". It's not the most modern name, but the organization was founded back in 1921. Now it is the largest women's movement in the state with hundreds of branches, uniting 800 thousand women of different nationalities. NAAMAT is closely associated with the Zionist movement, and its affiliated organizations, including those in the United States, are part of the World Zionist organization.

ORCA

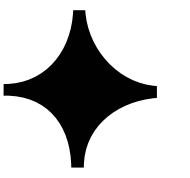
An international organization unites Israeli women who own businesses or in leadership positions, all over the world. It is a unique community that enhances networking opportunities for Israeli women and helps them advance their businesses and break through the glass ceiling. ORCA's mission is to help women grow and develop as professionals, business owners and individuals. The organization unites 55 countries and more than 35,000 companies.



Forum Dvora

A non-profit nongovernmental Dvora focuses on women in foreign policy and national security agencies, especially in the Israel Defense Forces. It fights to ensure women representation in key leadership fields, and believes that a women's approach will help to strengthen Israel's national security. The organization exists outside of political parties and religious movements.

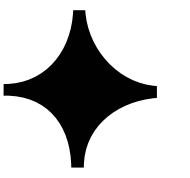

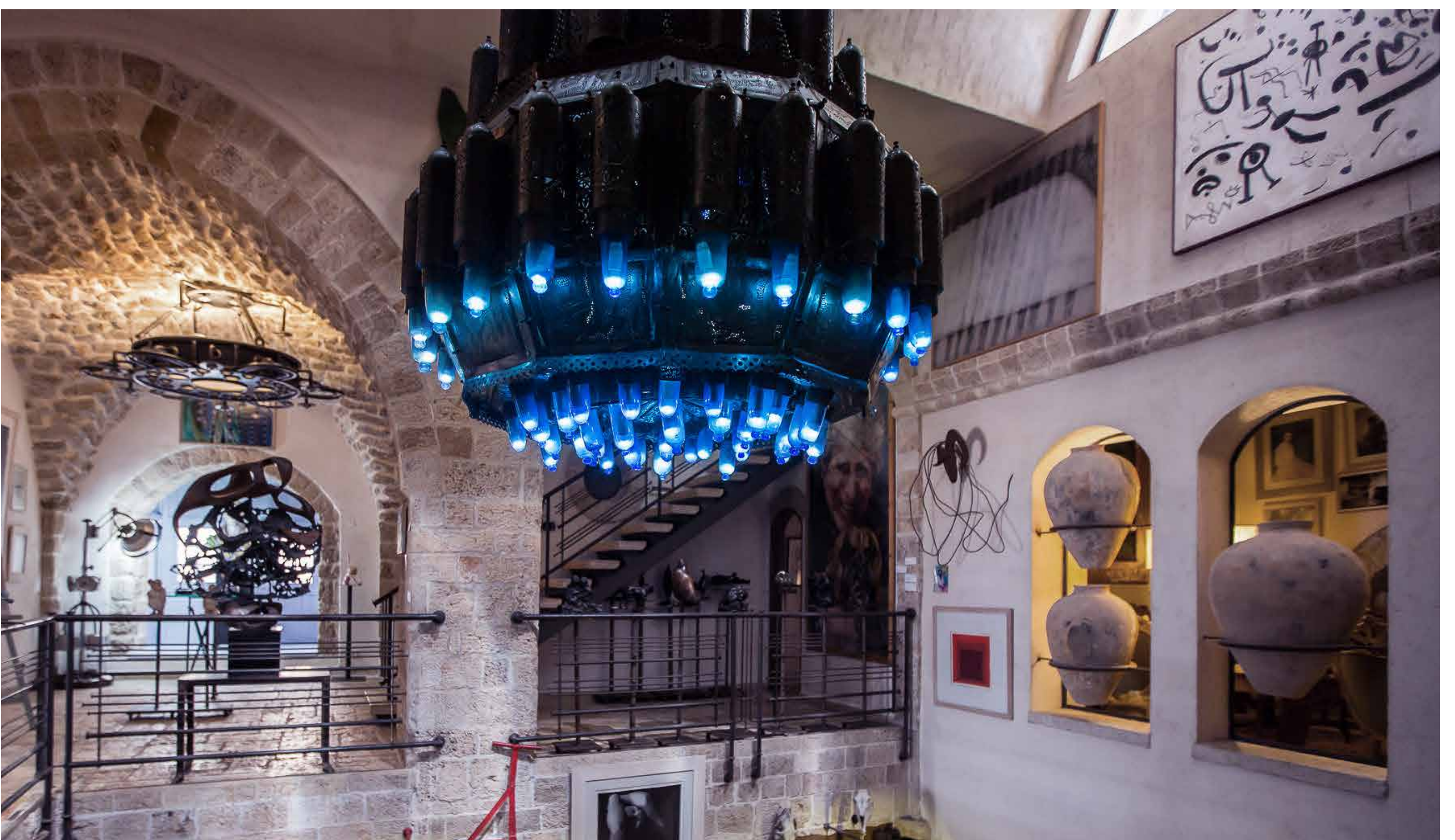

Ilana Gur Museum in Jaffa

The old art museum building, which in the 18th century served as a shelter for pilgrims, is located on a hill in old Jaffa overlooking the Mediterranean Sea and is considered a work of art in its own right. The museum itself, which is also the home of sculptor and designer Ilana Gur, was opened in 1995 and the exhibition consists of the founder's works and her collection - more than 600 works by artists from Israel and other countries. Ilana managed to create an unusual concept: sculptures, paintings and installations are not seen as a string of objects on a white background, but are all integrated into the environment, connected to each other and taking on new soundings and meanings.
